

Forest-nesting hawks, owls, falcons, and ravens and their nests in boreal Ontario: a workshop for MNR and forest industry staff



Purpose: To provide training needed to (1) identify forest-nesting hawks, owls, falcons, and ravens and their nests and (2) implement appropriate forest management guidelines in the boreal forest of northeastern Ontario. MNR's new (simplified) protocol for the handling of stick nests will be described.

Description: 1-day workshop (noon to noon) with class time and a field trip.

Location: Canadian Ecology Centre, Samuel de Champlain Provincial Park near Mattawa.

Date: Two one-day workshops will be offered. Choose either (1) noon Monday June 23 to noon Tuesday June 24, OR (2) noon Wednesday June 25 to noon Thursday June 26.
